

WARWICK HAYES Class of 1982

Dr Warwick Hayes graduated from Sydney Technical High School in 1982 and went on to secure a BSc (Hons) at Sydney University and a MAppSc and PhD at the University of Technology, Sydney.

Warwick was a cricketer with St George District Grade Club, who played first grade with St George, Sydney University and Western Suburbs, scoring a record 16,871 grade runs for St George (in all grades) with over 3,000 of those in first grade.

A life-member of the St George Club, he currently holds the record for most runs in the Sydney Grade Cricket Competition. Highlights for Warwick include his selection for the NSW Second XI in both 1988 and 1989, and his more recent selections in two Over 50's Australian teams, on tours of the United Kingdom and New Zealand (2017 and 2018).

Warwick also played grade Australian Rules with the St George Dragons AFL club in the Sydney competition, and baseball with the Cronulla Sutherland Major League Baseball Club. He currently holds a FFA Level 1 referees accreditation and is the appointments officer for the St George Football Referees Association.

In his business career, Warwick is a director of a large Environmental Consulting company, who spoke to the Sydney Technical High community about his role at an assembly in 2001.
