Dr Allan Huang is currently a Senior Lecturer in Statistics and the Statistics Major Convener at the University of Queensland.

Allan graduated from Sydney Technical High School in 2001, where he was dux of Visual Arts during hat year. Attending the University of Sydney, he competed his studies in 2006 with a Bachelor of Science in Advanced Maths, with first class honours, and the University Medal, but not before receiving the Tim Browne prize I and the Tim Browne II in successive years while studying.

This led him to the Australian Bureau of Statistics in Canberra, and then to becoming a research associate in the Department of Biostatistics and medical Informatics at the University of Wisconsin-Madison in the United States, also gaining a Doctor of Philosophy from the university of Chicago.

Further advancement came when he gained a position as the Dean's Initiative Postdoctoral Research Fellow in the School of Mathematical Sciences at UTS, Sydney, a position which is still ongoing (2017). Since 2014 he has been in his current position at University of Queensland.

Allan's research and publications are numerous, and he is constantly invited to deliver lectured in Statistics around Australis, including one each year over the past six years (to 2017), and in 2017 was special guest at Sydney Tech's Annual presentation of Prizes, where he gave a lecture on the algebraic modelling behind pixilation and art.

Allan's interests include cricket, touch Rugby, stringed musicianship in a weekly publication of Cryptic crosswords for the Queensland University, a skill learned and honed at this school.
