Bill Mansell (1952-1953) entered the construction and building design industry in the years following his graduation from Tech High. His tertiary education included Sydney Technical College, University of NSW, and University of Sydney. Over the years he became recognised as an expert in Australia in composite roof and ceiling systems, working with Australia's leading architects on such iconic buildings as the Sydney Entertainment Centre, the Sydney Football Stadium, the National Tennis stadium in Melbourne, the National Maritime Museum in Sydney, and the Sydney Aquatic centre for the 2000 Olympics. His projects have included overseas contracts in Asia and the Middle East as well, including Bangkok International Airport, Kuala Lumpur International Airport, Dubai International Air Terminal, and the Expo Railway Station in Singapore.

As design team leader and managing director for his group of companies, The Chadwick Technology Group, he has won awards for excellence in engineering and innovation. His outstanding contribution to the construction industry are recognised by the world's leading architects, engineers and builders, resulting in his admission as Doctor of Engineering (honorary PhD).
