Murray Milgate (1963-68) graduated from the University of Sydney and the University of Cambridge. He taught economics at Harvard University (1984-92) and then the University of Cambridge, where he is Fellow and Director of Studies in Economics at Queens' College. He shared Columbia University's Eccles Prize for Excellence in Economic Writing (1992). Murray is also a Distinguished Professor Emeritus in Osaka Gakuin University, Japan.

As a writer and academic economist, Professor Milgate is best known as co-creator and coeditor of the celebrated *New Palgrave Dictionary of Economics* and his writings on Keynesian economics. His books include: *Capital and Employment;*

Keynes's Economics and the Theory of Value and Distribution; Critical Issues in Social Thought; The World of Economics; Ricardian Politics; After Adam Smith; The Fall and Rise of Keynesian Economics.
