

ANDREW MILLICAN Class of 1983

Andrew Millican joined Randwick in 1980-81 as a 14-year-old wicketkeeper/batsman in their Green Shield Under 16 representative team. He made his 1st Grade debut at age 17 and was named 1st Grade captain in 1990-91. He held this position for seven years and won the Reschs Cup twice and NSW State Challenge defeating Newcastle at the SCG in the final. Two seasons later in 1993-94 he was named SCA 1st Grade Captain of the Year.

A graduating student from the class of 1983, Andrew played 1st Grade for the school as a wicketkeeper when he was in Year 9, joining a team where most players were already playing Grade Cricket. In his final year of schooling, Andrew also played 1st Grade Australian Rules and Proud Shield Baseball.

In 22 seasons, Andrew played 320 games for the Randwick Petersham Club. He played 245 in 1st Grade where he scored 6,694 runs of his club total of 8,901. He hit seven centuries in 1st Grade and eight overall, with the highest score of 152. Behind the stumps he effected 402 dismissals including 344 in 1st Grade (297 catches and 47 stumpings). In his early years he was the number one keeper for the NSW under 16's and 19's.

Andrew represented NSW in a second XI game against Australian Country and was the first person to be awarded life membership under the banner of the merged Randwick Petersham Club.

In addition, Millican played 1st Grade Australian Rules for the St George Club in the Sydney Premiere Division.

Currently, Andrew is a Head Teacher in the Education Department.
