

EUGEN MOLODYSKY

Class of 1969

Eugen Molodysky (1964-1969) graduated from the University of Sydney and in 1979 was appointed to St Margaret's Hospital, where, upon completing his professional qualification in obstetrics, was appointed as a VMO, a position he held until the closure of the hospital in 1998. In 1985, he was appointed to St Vincent's Private Hospital, where he still holds the first appointment as a Visiting Medical Specialist in General Practice. In 1987 he became a member of the RACGP, and in 1989 became Chair of the MEC of the NSW Faculty of the RACGP. In 2005 he was invited to sit on the national PVSC of the RACGP.

In 2000 Eugen was awarded a PhD for his contribution to our understanding of cervical cancer and in 2001, he was instrumental in establishing SIGET, of which he was elected as first chair (2001-2003). He continued as director participating in its growth to the present-day GP Synergy. In 2005, Eugen was conferred with the title, Clinical Associate Professor at the University of Sydney and in 2007 Adjunct Associate Professor at the University of Notre Dame Australia.

In 2006, Eugen was appointed to the Medical Board of NSW by the Governor of NSW. In 2008 Eugen was awarded the Medal of the Order of Australia (OAM) by the Governor General of Australia: For *service to medical education, particularly in the areas of general practice, through clinical teaching curriculum and professional development and research into cervical cancer prevention.*
